ABOUT THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Detroit Shoreway is located two miles west of downtown Cleveland, on a bluff overlooking Lake Erie. Detroit Shoreway is within Cleveland's **Ward 15**, and its current councilperson is Councilman Matt Zone.

The **Gordon Square Arts District** is the heart of the neighborhood along Detroit Ave (served by RTA's 26 bus) and home to theatres, restaurants, and businesses. The GSAD nonprofit organization leverages arts and culture to foster growth and livability.



Edgewater Park hosts 147 acres of greenspace and beaches to the north. **Michael J. Zone Recreation Center** provides sports, swimming, and year-round programming to the south. Many smaller greenspaces and community gardens are located in between.

The **Lorain Avenue Antiques District** is a two-mile district through Detroit Shoreway and Ohio City (served by RTA's 22 bus) with vintage shops and niche restaurants.

The **Cleveland EcoVillage** is a diverse, pedestrian-friendly community focused on sustainability and centered around RTA's West 65th-Lorain Red Line station (with connections to the airport, Downtown, and the east side of Cleveland).
